The Ever-present Healing Christ

I n thinking back over the past ■ 12 months, we are grateful for the many proofs of God's tender care and healing touch. Traditionally at this time of year, the world celebrates the birth of Christ Jesus, but Mrs. Eddy's statement in Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures reminds us that "...the Christ is without beginning of years or end of days." It is present every day of the year. We see signs of the Christ, Truth expressed in our lives moment by moment, and we know that this Christly presence heals, that it brings comfort and peace, regenerates and restores.

In this year-end newsletter we are pleased to share three experiences

that show in different ways how
Lynn House fulfills its commitment
as a haven for healing, how its
services reach out and make a
difference, and how the presence
of the healing Christ is available to
all who are in need. We hope you
will see that there is no situation—
no matter how small or how large
and daunting—that should ever
prevent you from picking up the
phone and calling us. Christian
Science nursing is an expression
of this healing Christ.

The first testimony is from someone who came to Lynn House for Outpatient care and later drew upon the resources of our Visiting Christian Science Nurse Service.

While working outdoors early one morning this summer, I had an accident that resulted in a large cut to the top of my head. Recovering from the initial shock, I immediately turned to the Truth and prayed for the right next steps to take. It occurred to me that this was a situation where most people would find themselves in an emergency room getting stitches. It seemed wise to clean the area around the wound and to stem the loss of blood. A practitioner was engaged for help, and my wife drove me to Lynn House, a considerable distance from where we live.

duty quickly and efficiently assessed the need and began to clean the area and prepare it for bandaging. The atmosphere was loving and the Christian Science nurse confident and professional. Being able to listen to the Bible Lesson provided spiritual inspiration. Another *Journal*-listed Christian Science nurse arrived and helped to complete the care that was being given.

Lynn House offered to make home-care visits when the bandage needed to be changed. Several visits followed and within a short time the bandage was no longer needed. The healing was complete. The Christian Science nurse who came to my home expressed insight and flexibility and was always willing to adapt her schedule to mine since I work from home.

What a blessing to have a place as supportive as Lynn House where I was received without question, where the assessment was done without fear about the circumstance or doubt as to the outcome, where the care was applied with confident professionalism, all in an atmosphere of love and spiritual support. And beyond that – I found that the qualities I had felt expressed while at Lynn House were present when the care was given in my home. The following hymn expresses my thoughts.
