Testimony from a Patient

E arlier this year, I fell on the floor in the middle of the night and found myself unable to get up or move. I live alone, but a neighbor and a man in charge of maintaining our building came to my rescue. They called 911 and I was taken to the hospital, where I remained for five days. During that time, Lynn House Visiting Christian Science nurses came four times at my request to read the Bible Lesson and share healing truths with me. I can't begin to say how comforting and uplifting their visits were. It was wonderful to feel the healing atmosphere they brought with them.

On the fifth day, I went to Lynn House, where I immediately felt the strong spiritual support of the Christian Science nurses who helped me during my joyful recovery. It was a time of spiritual growth and learning to listen for God's guidance. I needed to let go of human will and to trust my well-being to God.

Lynn House felt like a holy place. I was blessed by the spiritually scientific thought of the nurses surrounding me. Their tender, loving care was evident in everything they did. My heart remains filled with gratitude. I will always remember the Christian Science nurse who came into my room at night to sing a hymn before I went to sleep. On several occasions, another nurse came and played his flute.

I cherished the beautiful view outside my window, and as I watched the transformation from winter to spring, it reinforced for me this truth: "man's harmony is no more to be invaded than the rhythm of the universe." (*Retrospection and Introspection*, 61: 10-11) I also loved the audio system, which enabled me to hear hymns or the reading of *Science and Health* any time day or night. One hymn that became especially meaningful to me included these words: "If we live a life of prayer, God is present everywhere." (Hymn 341)

During my stay at Lynn House, my family decided it was time for me to move to a more convenient location, one that would be closer to my activities. I knew I must trust God wholeheartedly and be willing to do what He wanted me to do. One day, my son told me that he had found a new place for me. It was a perfect location, but it was an efficiency. Though in the past the thought of moving to such small quarters might have been hard to accept, I now felt fine with the idea, as I was learning to let go of human will and to trust. Several days later, my son announced that the new apartment was in fact a onebedroom penthouse. I was thrilled.

When I left Lynn House, I needed a walker, which the staff made available to me. But I soon found that I was able to walk on my own. A long-time friend helped me prepare for my move and together we got rid of 70 years of accumulation. I am now in my new home and loving it. How grateful I am to God for his healing presence and omnipotent care and how grateful I am to Lynn House and Christian Science nursing for being there for me when I needed them.
