

A HAVEN FOR SPIRITUAL PROGRESS AND HEALING

A deeper understanding of divine Science. The demonstration of God's healing power. This was what Lynn, MA signified in Mary Baker Eddy's long and incomparable career. And so it has proved an apt name for what Lynn House strives to show forth and embody.

Mary Baker Eddy first moved to Lynn, MA in 1865, and the following year she experienced the healing that set her on the course of discovering Christian Science. Her time in Lynn was devoted to consecrated study of the Bible in a desire to understand more of the divine law and the Life that is God. In the year 1875 she purchased the residence on 8 Broad Street, and that "Lynn house" was a haven for her for the next several years. It was in that home that she finished the first edition of *Science and Health*. It was a period of enormous portent and progress, as she continued sharing this Science with others through healing and teaching. In 1879 her students voted to organize the first Christian Science church, which "should reinstate primitive Christianity and its lost element of healing" (*Manual*, p. 17). By the time that Mary Baker Eddy left Lynn for Boston in 1882, she was the leader



of a growing movement devoted to sharing the healing power of the Christ.

In *Retrospection and Introspection*, Mary Baker Eddy referred to her time in Lynn this way: "The divine hand led me into a new world of light and Life, a fresh universe--old to God, but new to His 'little one'" (pp. 27-28). Her experience at Lynn gave her the spiritual understanding and strength to carry forward her God-given purpose.

A century later, when a group of Christian Scientists joined together to establish a Christian Science

nursing facility near the nation's capital in the late 1960's, the Lynn House name was chosen in reference to this place of spiritual study, demonstration, and progress. Over the past fifty years, Lynn House of Potomac Valley has seen and supported countless demonstrations of Christian healing – and we are delighted to share in this newsletter a few examples of recent healings.

While in Lynn, MA, it became evident to Mary Baker Eddy "that the divine Mind alone must answer, and be found as the Life, or Principle,

of all being; All Science is a revelation. Its Principle is divine, not human, reaching higher than the stars of heaven" (*Retrospection and Introspection*, p. 28). Similarly, we trust that every stay at Lynn House will bring a deeper understanding of God's law of infinite goodness. Whether coming to Lynn House as a patient, a Rest & Study guest, a volunteer, or an attendee at one of our programs, may you leave with a greater sense of divine Love's ever-presence and with renewed spiritual strength for the journey ahead.

In Mary Baker Eddy's remarkable *Message to The Mother Church for 1901*, there is a brief but powerful paragraph in which, in reference to what she calls "vital Christianity," she states:

"The magnitude of its meaning forbids headlong haste, and the consciousness which is most imbued struggles to articulate itself" (*Message for 1901*, p. 30).

To have a consciousness that is imbued with the Christ-spirit, is something greatly to be desired. It is something we all work and strive for. As we struggle to "articulate" this in our daily lives, to give it form and expression, we find that it demands of us an honesty, humility, and obedience, which is quite above the ordinary modes of human thinking.

It involves a struggle to "come out from the material world and be separate" (*Science and Health*, p. 451). To embody the Christ-like qualities that bring healing and comfort to our fellow man is to be of the highest service to humanity.

In our work at Lynn House we strive to embody this Christ spirit. From the moment a visitor enters our facility we work to ensure that his or her stay here is as harmonious and spiritually uplifting as it can be.

There's a lot to it. A clean and up-to-date building, good food served in an appetizing way, able administration that supports an orderly, problem-solving operation, and, most of all, a devoted and conscientious staff of Christian Science nurses that work round the clock in a loving and tender way to meet the needs of each patient — all these elements must blend and work together for good.

It is a tall order. The demands seem to be endless and we take them all seriously. It is encouraging in this regard to remember our Leader's assertion that:

"The Principle of Christianity is infinite: it is indeed God; and this infinite Principle hath infinite claims on man, and these claims are divine, not human; and man's ability to meet them is from God . . ." (*Miscellaneous Writings*, p. 16).

We are grateful for every healing victory and forward step along the way in this high calling. However, the "magnitude of its meaning" keeps us from having too high an estimate of our own abilities in this endeavor. Instead, we learn to turn ever more unreservedly to our Father-Mother God for direction and guidance.

In this work we are heartened by your steadfast and wholehearted support for Lynn House. Your sincere interest in its well-being and success means everything to us. To have such support and such friends is a blessing beyond words.

So, from all of us here at Lynn House, thank you for your generous and loving support.

GRATITUDE FOR HAND HEALED

My family is profoundly grateful for the loving nursing care we received from the Lynn House staff when my father's hand was lacerated in the autumn of 2017. Even though this occurred in the late evening, the Christian Science nurses were happy to receive us at Lynn House. The physical picture was serious, but the nurses remained calm, prayerful, and professional, lovingly engaging my father in uplifting conversation while they worked on the bandaging. The effective work of the practitioner, the nurses, and the family resulted in my father experiencing no pain during those hours.

We were grateful Dad was able to stay at Lynn House for a few nights since the bandage needed ongoing attention from a *Journal*-listed nurse. Once Dad came home, it became clear he needed help showering and dressing, in addition to needing periodic help with the bandage. So the Visiting Christian Science Nurse Service of Lynn House stepped in. It was inspiring to witness the dedication and joy of the nurses who came to the house every day for several weeks until there was no longer a need.

All during these weeks, healing was progressing steadily. The spiritual strength of the Lynn House nurses was evident as they tended to Dad's needs. It was a joyous day when the bandage came off for the last time and Dad had full use of his hand.

Our family is grateful for the spiritual growth we gained through this beautiful healing. Our gratitude includes Mary Baker Eddy's *Manual* provision for Christian Science nursing. My father appreciated the loving and respectful care he received both in the Lynn House facility and from Lynn House's visiting CS nurse staff. He said, "If you need physical help when working on healing through Christian Science, Lynn House is the place to be."
