What is our ultimate destination? (Is it to see ever more clearly our oneness with God? To recognize that the Kingdom of Heaven truly is at hand?) How do we get there? How are we interacting with those who are on the road with us?

Mary Baker Eddy has written: "Your decisions will master you, whichever direction they take" (Science and Health, p. 392). Every thought and

home healed. Although Lynn House is required by the Virginia Department of Health to continue masking, this hasn't slowed down or prevented healings from occurring!

Newness is the forward direction for Lynn House today. In recent years, it became apparent that Christian Science nurses' housing is a high priority. The board metaphysically worked on how to undertake this project while at the same time keeping our Christian Science nursing mission as the primary focus.

Inspired by the book of Nehemiah we asked ourselves: What are we building? What is the purpose? Who is giving us the authority for this action? How will we handle suggestions that might want to distract us? It all starts with listening to God. What is Mind leading us to do? Then we follow step by step.

The question arises, how will we pay for this new housing? It reminded us of Elisha asking the widow woman: "What hast thou in the house?" (II Kings 4: 1-7) As Christian Scientists we know this to mean: what do you have already in thought? Though the widow woman only had a small pot of oil, as she continued to pour, the supply became evident.

The purpose of this building project is to offer appropriate housing and training space for Christian Science nurses coming to support

> healing at Lynn House. Only right ideas will go forward. We are grateful to those who have already donated towards this idea as it is unfolding.

New Cottage

At the corner of our property is a cottage that was built in the 1940's (pre-dating Lynn House). We have been using it to provide temporary housing for Christian Science nurses. It has been a home-away-from-home for:

- Contract Christian Science nurses working at Lynn House on an interim basis
- Student Christian Science nurses coming for training and/or mentoring
- Newly-hired Christian Science nurses moving to the area and needing a place to stay before getting permanently settled

After many years of ongoing repairs, the cottage is now in need of replacement. In early 2020, we received a generous gift toward this project, and over the past couple of years, we have been working with an architect on a new design. It includes:

- Temporary living accommodations for at least four Christian Science nurses
- Flexible space that can be used for Christian Science nurses training classes

Now that we have developed the initial plans, we have been given an estimated cost for this project: \$2.5 million. We have set up a Building Project Fund and are on the verge of launching a Building Fund campaign. We are grateful to be moving forward on this important project. You'll hear more from us in the weeks to come!
