God truly meets all our needs — Learning to expect nothing but good

Several months ago, my father and I had a wonderful experience with Lynn House. My father, who lives in the midwest, was experiencing some difficulties and needed 24-hour nursing care. As neither of my siblings nor I live close to our father, finding an available Christian Science nurse to come to his home for an extended period was proving difficult. My sister decided to call the two Christian Science nursing facilities closest to him, but they were both full and only able to put him on their wait lists. We were at a dead end ... or were we? It was obvious to us, having been raised in a Christian Science Sunday School, that it was time to stop and listen for the one Mind to tell us what to do. Then the answer came so clearly. Why were we looking for a place near where he lived? That

would mean we'd have to get on a plane to go visit him. The message from God was loud and clear and so obvious – call Lynn House! When we called, we found that they had an opening and would hold a room for him. It was that easy, which as we know in Christian Science indicates that it is a right idea – God's idea.

A few days later, we arrived at Lynn House. The staff was warm and friendly, meeting us in the parking lot and helping us from the moment we pulled up at the curb. I relaxed knowing that he was in a place where everyone would be working metaphysically to know the Truth about my dad and simply would not be giving the material picture any power.

After my dad got into his room, he asked the Director of Operations, Nathan, for a

lengthy list of things to make it feel just like home. Nathan was loving and accommodating. However, he shared with me privately that he didn't want my dad to get too comfortable as the expectation was that he wasn't going to be there long. That was an eye opener for me. I hadn't been seeing my dad as already perfect and that going back home was not only a possibility, but God's law. Sure enough, in less than 2 months, my dad went from needing 24-hour care to being ready to go home. The Christian Science nurses and the entire staff at Lynn House were so supportive and loving towards my dad and me. We are both very grateful for everything that everyone at Lynn House did for us and we're very grateful for our growth in Christian Science and the healing that it brought.

From the Executive Board

Good is going on at Lynn House. In this quiet sanctuary, there is healing and support – and, of course, love, love, love. “Love is reflected in love” (S&H 17:7). Our Christian Science nurses and other staff, the Executive Board and Corporate members, and our many supporters in the field have joined in strengthening and protecting our work. The Manual-based foundation for the Christian Science Nurse is instrumental in our mission to support quick and whole healing – and we are seeing healing and wonderful progress among those coming to Lynn House for care.

The general belief that there is a shortage of nurses is also a claim for our Christian Science nursing facilities. Having enough staff to meet the demands of this work has been a challenge across the movement. We are praying to see more clearly that God is our true source of supply, and we are seeing creative solutions come to light. We’ve had folks return to Christian Science nursing, and we are finding ways to bolster the training and mentoring we are able to provide for those wanting to join and progress in this ministry. To cover our 24/7 schedule, our core group of staff Christian Science nurses is supplemented by Christian Science nurses who are based at other facilities or who normally work private duty and help at Lynn House as they are able. We are so grateful for the dedication of all these Christian Science nurses and the way that they work harmoniously as a team. We don’t take any of this for granted, but we recognize that it is Love meeting each need.

The Board has been faithfully supporting, encouraging, and of course praying for our



facility about strengthening operations. This has been a year of “doing more with less” while still upholding the highest standards for providing care. We have seen an increase in usage of our services, demonstrating a clear need for what Lynn House offers. In the coming year, we will have a campaign to strengthen Lynn House financially, to build up our endowment and bolster sustainability.

With God as the source of all, we know goodness is eternal, abundant, and ever-available. There are so many examples of sustenance evident in the Scriptures – manna and quail for the children of Israel, the widow with the oil that supplied her and her two sons, and of course Christ Jesus' feeding of the multitude. We have clear evidence of Spirit's

abundant supply, and we know this applies to Lynn House and all our Christian Science nursing facilities.

“Science is neither a law of matter nor of man. It is the unerring manifesto of Mind, the law of God, its divine Principle” (Miscellaneous Writings 1883–1896, Mary Baker Eddy, p. 22:3–5). Update on Housing Project

As mentioned in our last newsletter, Lynn House has plans underway to replace the cottage on the corner of our property. The cottage was closed a few years ago due to structural issues, and we are working to replace it with a building that will support our Christian Science nurses. The new building will provide short-term housing for those Christian Science nurses coming to work at Lynn House on a temporary basis (or moving here to join our staff, but needing a short-term place to stay while getting settled) and space for Christian Science nurses training .

As we have begun working with the City of Alexandria on the permitting process, some issues have come to light that have caused us to consider reworking the architectural design for the new building. While we are taking some time to pause and evaluate various options, this project remains a high priority.
